Dear fellow residents,

I have had the pleasure of sharing my diversified managerial background with you all in the past. As a Retail Executive, I was the Marketing Director for upscale malls, department store and Corporate Buyer, with my last buying responsibility for Marshall's of 32 million dollars. Oh, if only LVE had 32 Mil in the kitty!

I am second generation here as my parents moved into their retirement home in 1973. My children were 6 and 9. Now they are old! Since I retired back in 2017, I achieved a Certificate (CMCA) as a Community Manager while I was in Florida and NJ recognizes it. I am Certified in ADR and was the chair person. Other committee involvements: CORA, Budget, Rules & Regulations, By Laws, Beautification, Trustee for 3 1/2 years and served as president. I am presently the Secretary of the Heritage Club and Italian American Club.

During my stint as President, we dealt with the major fire on Inverness Ct. and COVID! We were the first community to have the vaccine distributed to our residents. To meet insurance requirements, as the fire started in the 50-year-old electric panel, we passed a Resolution requiring all 1412 panels be replaced! The PPP grant we received, by meeting certain criteria, was distributed with half of the \$403,000 off setting an increase in maintenance fees for the 2021 Budget. The balance was placed in the Replacement Fund.

My Board voted to allow 2 guests to get car decals to make life easier. We created Circle Park for a minimal cost as it was a disaster. Barton Hall had the exterior painted and the interior was cleaned top to bottom. The gazebo with rotting piles was replaced. We updated computers and carried on with day -to-day repairs as required by the Reserve Study.

This Board worked very hard to comply with all the CDC and Governors rules while maintaining a positive outlook on a daily basis. The Board was awarded "The Best Board" with over 1000 homes, voted by their peers, from the Community Association Institute (CAI) for their diligence even with 3 trustees resigning. It is showcased in our lobby. A Management company was hired for a one-year contract to fulfill accounting needs. That contract came in under budget as did the audited LVE budget for the 2020-2021 year.

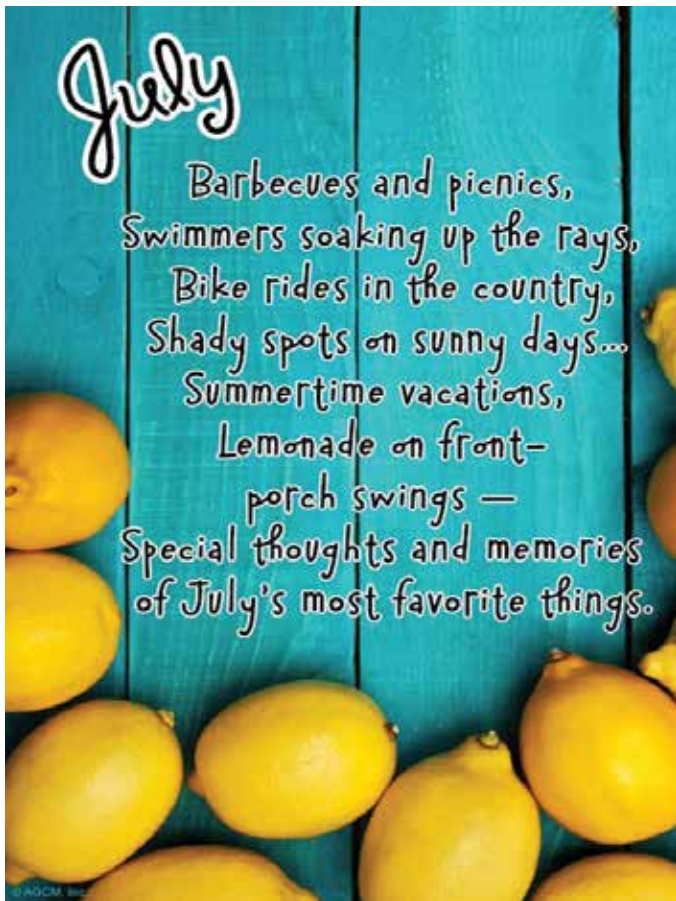

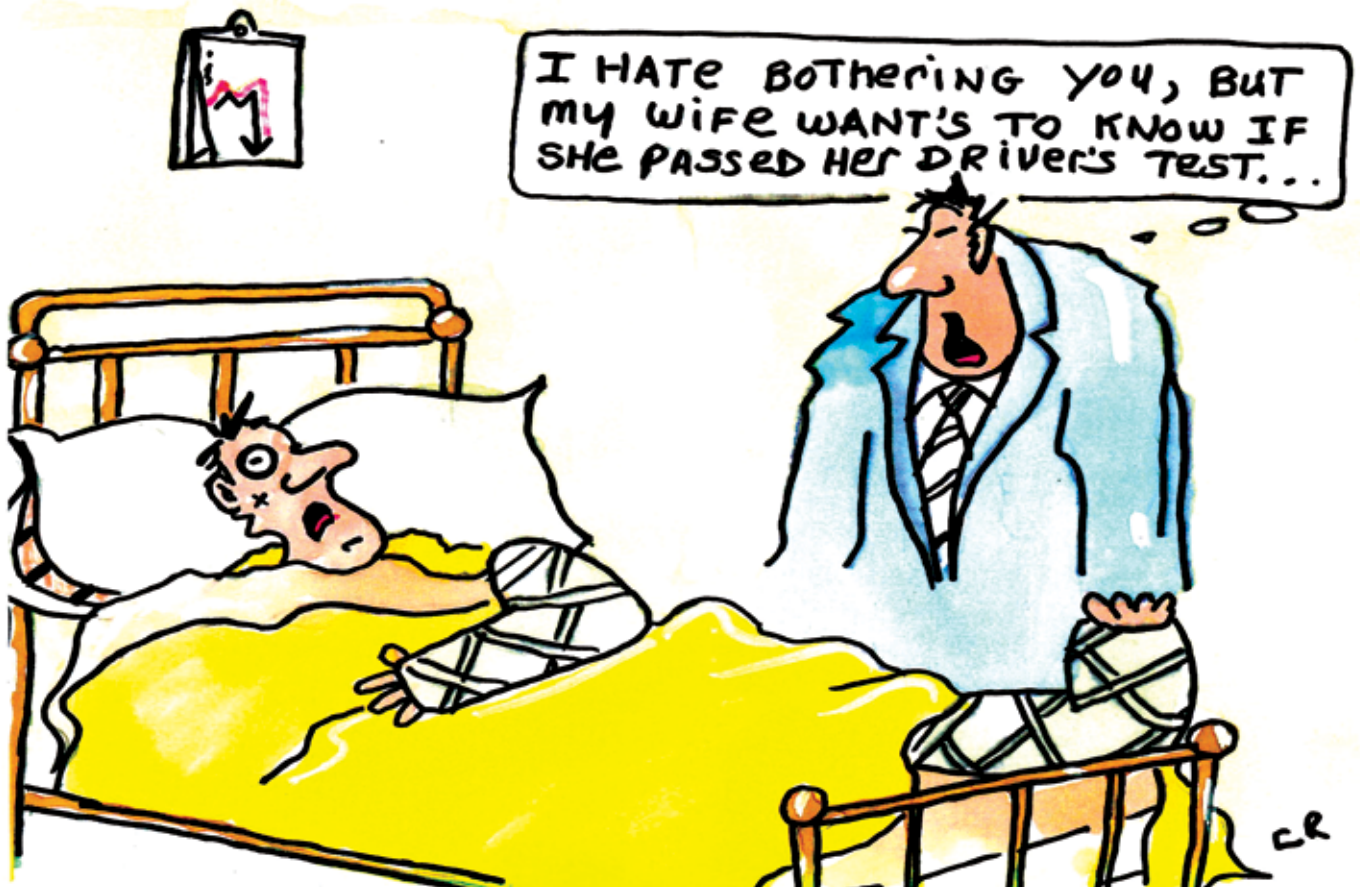

★ Fork Painted Fireworks Craft ★

Celebrate the 4th of July with this fork painted fireworks craft! Use forks to stamp paint on paper, creating beautiful red, white, and blue fireworks. Then sprinkle on some glitter for a little extra sparkle!

Materials Needed

- Red paint
- Blue paint
- White paint
- Black cardstock (or construction paper)
- Fine silver glitter
- Equipment:
- Paper plate (to use as paint palette)
- 3 Plastic forks (or regular dinner forks)



Instructions ★ ★ ★

Step 1: Prepare for stamping: Add red, white, and blue paint to a paper plate, making sure the colors aren't touching. Dip the bottom of a fork into your first paint color (we chose blue). Rock the fork back and forth to make sure the back of the tines are completely covered in paint.

Step 3: Make the first layer of the fireworks: Stamp the bottom of the fork onto the paper. Re-dip the fork as needed and continue stamping the fork at different angles, around an imaginary circle in the center. Using the same color of paint, add fork marks in-between the last stamps you made. This time, drag your fork outwards to make the firework larger. You may need to dip your fork in the paint a couple of times to make these lines. Fill in the rest of the paper with fireworks. We were able to fit 4 fireworks total on our page, 2 with a blue base and 2 with a red base.

Step 4: Add the second and third layers of paint: Wait about 15 minutes for the first layer of paint to dry, and then stamp a layer of white fireworks overtop of the blue and red ones. Do not drag your fork for this layer. Allow to dry. Add a third and final layer of paint to the fireworks. Stamp a blue layer on the red and white fireworks, and a red layer to the blue and white ones.

Step 5: Sprinkle glitter on the fireworks: While the final layer of paint is still wet, sprinkle glitter over the fireworks. Shake off the excess glitter and allow your fireworks to dry.

FOOD AND ICE SAFETY AT BARTON HALL

In case you haven't noticed, MOST of the events held at Barton Hall revolve around my favorite subject: FOOD. Whether catered, prepared in the Barton Hall kitchen, or brought in as BYO, food borne pathogens (i.e., germs) pose a constant threat to our health. We are responsible for creating our own safe food environment.

PLEASE DO NOT USE GREEN BUCKETS FOR SERVING ICE

A recent caterer called our attention to the green handled "buckets" that sit on top of the ice machine. These buckets are seldom (if ever) washed/sanitized and yet they are regularly used to serve ice and even beverages during Barton Hall events. Being porous, they are perfect hosts for pathogens. Yet, we willingly take ice from these containers for our beverages without a second thought.

NEW ICE BUCKETS AND COOLER

The Entertainment Committee has made some changes to ICE safety at Barton Hall.

1. A resident has donated a rolling, red ice cooler. This should be used to hold and serve clean ice ONLY. Please do not add cans or bottles to this cooler.
2. We have purchased two clear, sanitary ice buckets for transporting ice to the cooler. They are stored near the ice machine. They have a hook that allows them to hang on the ice machine while they are being filled. Please store them UPSIDE DOWN on top of the ice machine with a paper towel to absorb water.

YOU ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR CREATING A SAFE FOOD ENVIRONMENT

Every utensil, cutting board, and countertop, as well as the rolling cooler and the ice buckets should be sanitized BEFORE using. Directions for creating a sanitizing solution are posted on the wall, under the air conditioner. The sanitizing solution should be sprayed onto work surfaces and allowed to sit for 5 minutes. Utensils and cutting boards should be washed and then rinsed in a sanitizing solution. Litmus papers for testing bleach concentration are also on the wall under the air conditioner.

DO NOT USE CLOTH TOWELS and WASHCLOTHS FOR KITCHEN TASKS

AS A BEST PRACTICE, never use cloth towels for washing and drying. Cloth material provides a great breeding ground for pathogens; paper towels are a preferred alternative.

THE HAND-WASHING SINK IS FOR HAND-WASHING ONLY!

This is a health department requirement. Please do not wash dishes, store dirty dishes, drain dishes, or prepare food in this sink.

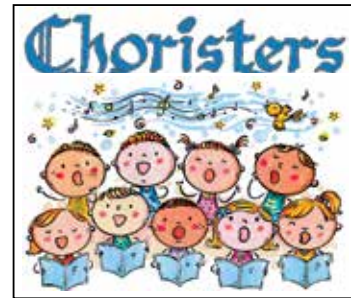

Sunrise is getting later in the morning this time of year, so it's a great time to get our sunrise shots.

It is important to use the rule of thirds. Try not to put the sun in the middle of the frame. Place it toward the side. Having something in the foreground will strengthen your image, especially if it is on the opposite side from the sun.

If you want a silky look to the water, use a tripod and a long exposure. Sunrise images are much better with some clouds to reflect the sun's colors.

Check the monitor on the back of your camera to make certain the



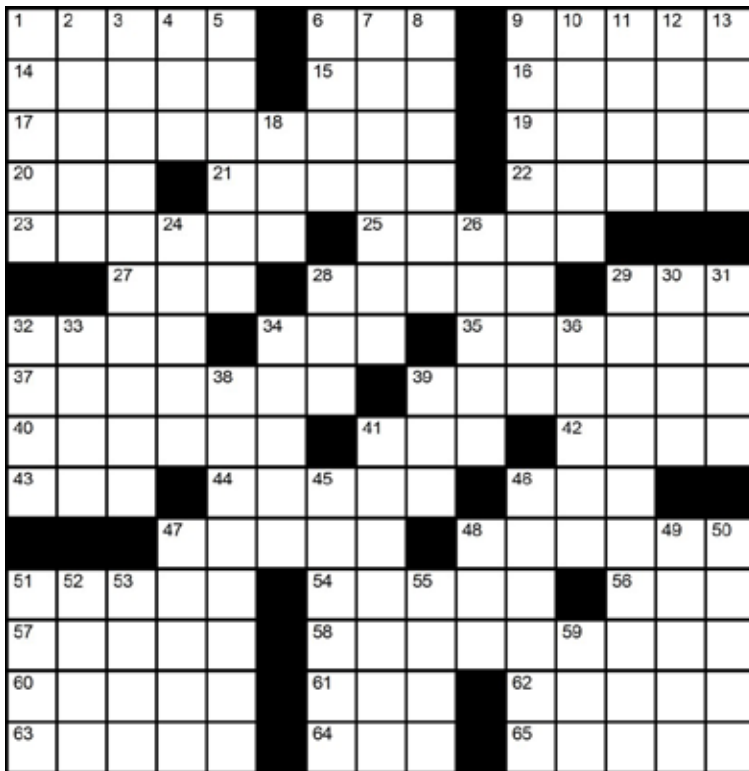
exposure is good. Your foreground objects will generally be silhouetted but you want them not to be completely dark.

If you include people in the shot and you don't want them silhouetted use your flash to light them up.

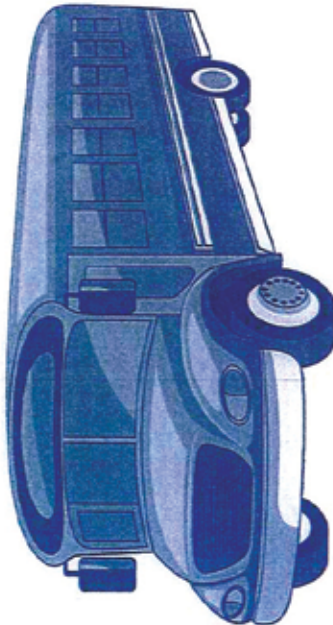
